About L'Arche Calgary

L'Arche Calgary is a part of an international Federation, with 160 communities in 37 countries worldwide.

L'Arche Calgary was founded in 1973.

51 years ago in August 1973 the first ever L'Arche Calgary home, called Marymount, was established and thus began the journey!

These past 51 years have been filled with memories, joy, celebration, beautiful traditions, meaningful relationships, countless milestones and so much love!

Over the many years, L'Arche Calgary has welcomed hundreds of beautiful people including, assistants, core-members, friends, family members, volunteers, and each person has left a unique imprint on this community that we will always remember and cherish.

Over the last 51 years we have grown to be 5 houses, a Day Program (Tamarack Day Program) and a Supported Independent Living Program (SILP).

In our houses - Annapurna, Haeremai, Kichiyak, Marymount, and Villa Maria - core-members live alongside assistants who join us from all over the world. Each house is unique, just like its inhabitants. People with and without intellectual disabilities experience the rhythms of daily life alongside one another.



Whether sharing supper on a typical Tuesday or going out to celebrate a special occasion, our family model of care allows us to build trust and mutual relationship.

Our Tamarack Day Program provides engaging programs and activities for Core Members from Monday to Friday. Our individualized approach ensures that each person's day is relevant to their goals, interests, and needs. Assistants provide support both on-site and on community outings, from music therapy to baking, there is something for everyone at Tamarack.

Our Support Independent Living Program (SILP) is designed to help core-members to live independently while receiving the support they need. Core members receive assistance ranging from occasional visits to regular help with daily tasks as meal preparation, transportation, and medical administration. This program enhances their personal, social, and spiritual well-being, promoting independence and their integration in the broader community.





Our New Funding and Development Coordinator.

Christian's journey with L'Arche Calgary began more than ten years ago when he joined as a Day Program Assistant. Growing up with a sister with a disability, he has always held a deep appreciation for L'Arche's model of care, which provides an environment where participants are cherished and supported, allowing their families peace of mind. Reflecting on his time at L'Arche, Christian says, "L'Arche is a place where our core members can truly feel at home."

Christian's path has been diverse and full of exploration. Initially, he pursued nursing at the University of Calgary, driven by a desire to care for others and make a meaningful impact. However, his journey took him through various disciplines, including geology, civil engineering, and software engineering, before he ultimately graduated with a degree in communications and media studies. Throughout these changes, Christian remained connected to L'Arche, spending weekend nights as Annapurna's awake overnight assistant, and continually drawn back to the community he deeply cared about.

In addition to his work at L'Arche, Christian has gained extensive experience in advertising, marketing, and sales, primarily working with startups. His roles in these fields allowed him to develop a diverse skill set, but he always felt something was missing. He realized that while he was successful, he lacked a true sense of purpose. "In my previous positions, I often felt like I was just going through the motions," Christian shares. "I was unsure of exactly why I was doing what I was doing. Returning to L'Arche allowed me to use my skills for a cause I genuinely believe in."



Christian's role the **Fundraising** as Development Coordinator at L'Arche Calgary is a perfect blend of his professional expertise and personal passion. He is dedicated to ensuring that L'Arche continues to thrive and exceptional care to its core members. His unique perspective as a sibling of a person with a disability informs his approach, making him deeply empathetic and committed to the mission of L'Arche.

Reflecting on his journey and his new role, Christian says, "I believe it's essential to have faith in your work and to pursue what truly matters.. Growing up with a sister with a disability, I've seen firsthand how harsh the world can be for the vulnerable. To me, L'Arche is a breath of fresh air —a place where kindness is given, appreciated, and reciprocated, not something to be taken for granted."

One of the significant challenges L'Arche faces in the coming months is rebuilding three of its homes. This project will require the dedication and support of the entire community. Christian, along with the L'Arche Calgary team, is committed to contributing to these efforts with passion and determination, fully aware of the challenges ahead. Though the task is substantial, Christian and the entire community are confident in taking it on together, supported by the strong spirit of unity and collaboration that defines L'Arche.

Duncan lived with is family until he moved into a residence with the Calgary Association for the mentally Handicapped where he was reportedly unhappy. Duncan arrived to L'Arche Calgary for a brief stay in Villa Maria in 1979 but returned home due to relationship problems.

Duncan was formally welcome into L'Arche on January 13th, 1981. During is 42 years in L'Arche Calgary Duncan lived in Marymount, Annapurna and moved to SILP.

Duncan was caring, thoughtful and kind-hearted. He treated everyone with respect and sensitivity and took a personal interest in people's lives and families. He paid attention to others and was very intuitive as to what people's concerns and needs were, so that he could inquire after them. He had a witty, observant sense of humour and made people laugh. Duncan loved a good party and enjoyed signing and dancing. He never shied away from the spotlight and was an entertaining performer and public speaker. His signature song was, "What A Wonderful World" and his impersonation of Louis Armstrong always put a smile on people's faces.
